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GRAPIPRANT

(Brand Name: Galliprant)

STRENGTH: 20 mg, 60 mg, 100 mg Tablets

ROUTE OF ADMINISTRATION: ORAL

Should be given on an empty stomach if possible for best absorption into the body.

ACTION OF MEDICATION: Non-Steroidal Anti-inflammatory Drug of the piprant class (prostaglandin EP4 receptor blocker).

MOST COMMON SIDE EFFECTS REPORTED: Loose stools with mucus or blood, vomiting, reduced appetite. These can be mitigated by giving the medication with food. Elevations in the ALP and ALT blood tests (liver enzymes). Reduction in blood albumin levels (it is unknown how serious this is but is currently believed mild).

SEVERE SIDE EFFECTS REPORTED: The effects listed above are believed to occur mildly but if they seem to be more severe, they should be reported to your veterinarian.

STORAGE: Keep away from light and store at room temperature. Do not refrigerate.

IF YOU MISS A DOSE: Do not double up on the next dose. Simply give the medication when it is remembered or pick up with the next dose, allowing at least the proper interval between doses according to the label instructions.

OTHER INFORMATION: Safety has not been evaluated in dogs under 8 lbs of body weight, in puppies under 9 months of age or in pregnant/nursing dogs. Dogs with the MDR1 mutation have an increased risk of upset stomach on this medication and will require a dose reduction to mitigate this. The role of the prostaglandin EP4 receptor may be important in heart disease. This medication should be used with caution in patients with heart disease.
