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PHENYLPROPANOLAMINE

(Brand Names: Prion, Propalin)

STRENGTH: 25 mg, 50 mg, 75 mg CHEWABLE Tablets
18 mg, 38 mg, 74 mg and 145 mg EXTENDED RELEASE Tablets

ROUTE OF ADMINISTRATION: ORAL. May be given with or without food.

ACTION OF MEDICATION: Alpha receptor stimulator used almost exclusively for the control of urinary incontinence.

MOST COMMON SIDE EFFECTS REPORTED: Reduced appetite, irritability, dilated pupils, mild upset stomach, panting. An increase in thirst may be noted.

SEVERE SIDE EFFECTS REPORTED: Hypertension (high blood pressure), urinary protein loss. Either of these issues would necessitate discontinuing the medication.

STORAGE: Keep away from light and store at room temperature. Do not refrigerate.

IF YOU MISS A DOSE: Do not double up on the next dose. Simply give the medication when it is remembered and time the next dose according to the instructions.

OTHER INFORMATION: Do not use this product within 2 weeks of use of an Amitraz containing tick control product. For other drug interactions, see the link below. Proin tablets are liver flavored which may increase the potential for overdose if the pet considers them a high value treat. Keep this medication in a safe location. Extended release tablets are made for once daily use but they may not be cut or split and thus cannot be used in dogs under 10 lbs.
